




COASTAL DATA INFORMATION PROGRAM

Southern California Wave Buoys



Buoy measures wave height, wave direction, wave period and sea surface temperature. The data are broadcast on the NWS Marine Weather Channel. Data are also **updated every 30 minutes** on the web at <http://cdip.ucsd.edu> (click on RECENT).

The wave height reported is the "significant" wave height (H_s) which represents the average of the 1/3 highest waves. The maximum wave height is approximately double the H_s .
*Please stay clear of the wave buoys.
The buoy emits a flashing yellow light at night.*
